About the EKE-junior weekend in a nutshell



In the middle of February I was taking part at an EKE-junior weekend in Piliscsaba in the Bethel Mission Center.

The theme of the weekend was marriage, sexuality and family in the scale of the Bible. We were taught purely according to God's word by pastors and experienced fellow-Christians, who are in personal relationship with God and who understood His will and aim in connection with marriage through studying God's word.

God blessed this weekend, because where His word is preached purely, it judges their sinful hearts and His grace frees people from their sins.

During the weekend we heard several preaches and we could speak about our impressions and questions in small groups, in which we could talk confidently about our problems with the experienced group leader in the presence of God. Unfortunately, the values of the world are up against the God's value and less and less people know, what is good, beloved and perfect according to Him. They are seeking newer and newer relationships to find the real one and happiness.

However they could only find this happiness in Jesus, who died for us voluntarily and with his sacrifice, we have free way to the Father, with whom we can have a personal relationship too. Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14, 6)

First, we have to find connection with Jesus and let Him renew this connection with His grace. After that through paying attention to Him and under His lordship He can give us our partner. This is not being naïve but having faith in God, who knows us and loves us and knows what the best for us is. With him we can and have to wait for the gift of sexuality until marriage, even though it is not easy to be pure in this field, but it worths waiting.

The following stands in the Ten Commandments about sexuality: "You shall not commit adultery." Every extramarital sexual interaction is adultery according to God, and therefore it is sin.

In a lot of situations it is not easy to keep our amorousness heart under control, but God could help. He blesses this period of waiting, and prepares us for the future marriage and family life. He teaches us to take responsibilities, to respect the other person and most of all to be faithful to Him.

We should be thankful because on this weekend we could meet newly married couples as living proofs, who could talk about their experiences in connections with this topic, who kept themselves pure before their marriage.

For me their testimonies were very encouraging and strengthening, as an addition to the whole message and content of the weekend. It was also pleasant that youngsters from all around the country came to this weekend, although many of them had no connection with congregations.

The recent EKE-weekend was in February in Piliscsaba. More than fifty young adults came together to hear God's word. The topic of the weekend was the second most important question in someone's life: Who will be my husband or wife according to God's plan? Who will be my helper in life?

Why is this question important? Because God says: "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil." (Ecclesiastes 4, 9)

Lot of my friends took part on this weekend, and one of them, who was not the follower of Jesus, could accept God's grace. This friend of mine is also became a citizen of God's Kingdom.

During this weekend a very important message became more certain in me:

The most important thing in this life is that we first seek the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. He gives us everything in its own time, as for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven



Provision of parts

Jamie continues to serve as parts room supervisor at our aviation department here in Papua New Guinea (PNG). Over the past few months, he has seen how God has been providing the parts for our aircraft so that they can continue to fly. One particular provision of parts was for a helicopter. A mechanic was replacing some worn parts (rod ends on a control tube), when he realized that the control tube was damaged and needed replacement. Just a few days earlier this mechanic had been visiting another mission organization in PNG and noticed a really long box in their parts room. When he asked about the box, they said it was a control tube that had been ordered by mistake a long time ago and they didn't have a need for it. Well, when we discovered that we needed a new control tube, the mechanic remembered the box sitting in the other mission's parts room. So we contacted the mission, and it was the very part we needed!

But that was just the beginning of God's provision of parts. We had another part, a shaft, which we needed to replace on the helicopter. We had already ordered it from a company in Singapore, and according to the helicopter manufacturer, there were only three available in their whole worldwide inventory until more were made in a few months. Then the company in Singapore came back to us and said that the three shafts were no longer available. So what were we supposed to do? Well in the process of obtaining the control tube from the other mission, we became aware of an aircraft parts supply company in Arizona. We contacted them in hope that maybe they might have one of these shafts in their stock. They wrote back and said that they had two of them! So we bought one and had it shipped directly to us by DHL. It was in our hands within a week. This was pretty much all a God thing as we normally don't get things that quickly, and our only licensed helicopter mechanic at the time was leaving for a month just a few days after this part arrived. If we hadn't gotten the part in time, that helicopter would not have been available for use for the whole next month. Praise God for His provision!

The doctor has asked to check his white blood count again when he gets a fever to make sure he is alright. But because he remains so healthy, the expectation is that he actually does have the ability to fight off bacteria, and his numbers will go in the right direction if he gets an infection. 
