

News from EKE - Hungary



Bulcsú József Széll was born in Dombóvár, on August 31, 1949, as the fifth child of László Széll and Margit Orosz. He turned to the Lord at the age of 17, on the Christmas of 1966, when the Word of God, "Today a Savior was born for you," found him personally.

He got very fond of spiritual songs, and as he wanted to learn to sing them in a better way, he enrolled to the cantor training institute in Fót, and studied playing on the harmonium. It was here he got to know János Sámuel Győri, who became his good friend, and invited him to the youth group in Nagytarcsa. In Nagytarcsa, he got to know Éva Magdolna Győri, whom he Under the pressure of communism in the '80s, he tried to gather believer pastors into a fellowship of prayer. Later, the fellowship of EKE (Fellowship of Lutherans for the Gospel) grew out of this circle. Every year, he organized several evangelistic weeks in Piliscsaba, where he served with the Word of God. He started education of lay people in our church by founding a Bible School.

Still in the '80s, he translated John Stott's work, "I believe in preaching" (U.S. edition: "Between Two Worlds"), from English. Later, as the pastor of the Kispest congragation, he began to work on the revision of the Károli Bible; especially on the retranslation of the Hebrew text.

He was an example both as a pastor and a father. He loved his ministry, looked for ministry opportunities until last minute, worked in the mission field; even his disease could not hinder him. Yet his children did not feel neglected; he cared about them much; they learned love and commitment from him. They got much from him spiritually, in the form of family devotions and congregational services, and also from his playful, humorous manner.

His body was attacked by the serious disease of cancer in 2012. A long fight for life followed. Finally, after years of hard suffering, the Lord of life and death showed His mercy, calling him home on June 7, 2017. May his memory be blessed. Daughter: Éva Anna Széll (Ms Matisz)

MORE TESTIMONIES OF GOD'S WORK IN EKE

The children's camp in Bokod, was a joint effort between Bokod and the Öttevény camp after working separately for five years, was held last week, with 45 children.

It was joy for me to hold a camp together with Pastor Gergő Kósa again. In the mornings, we were learning from the CEF material "Jesus is my Savior and my Friend" in three teams each for a different age group.

In the afternoon, we learned about the work God did through the missionary Mary Slessor in the 19–20th century.

In the evening, Gergő, (in one of the evenings he was subbed by Dénes Juhász) spoke of the way to be freed from sin, according to Psalm 32.

The preparation for the camp was done very late. Several factors made it more difficult than in previous years. Applications for the camp came in very slowly; by the deadline, no more than 12 children promised (orally) to come; even on the week just before the camp, I had to change the groups and room assignments again and again.

The camp started with difficulties: we had no warm water, and no cooking stoves were available, but God provided a technician who finally solved the problem.

The children were manageable, there was no significant disobedience. Many of the campers were adopted or foster children, they fit very well among the others; their presence was a special joy to me. They often remind me of the Parable of the Banquet. The foster parents were happy to have this opportunity, and they appreciated it from the very beginning.

I was with the older children in the camp. I had been wishing to help them with the daily practice of reading the Bible. I used both the morning and the afternoon meetings for that. First making a decision to accept and want God to work in their lives, we proceeded on the way of reading, observing and understanding the Bible, to obey it afterwards. We read Philippians, first everyone for themselves, then discussing it together, so that they practice understanding a particular passage and to make the right conclusions. On Thursday afternoon I was able to have a personal talk to almost everyone in the group, offering strengthening to the already saved, and the way of salvation to the unsaved. To my joy, the daughter of a friend of mine received Jesus into her heart. We enjoyed the support of the local church both in donations and in their help in making the meals. It was good to welcome (as usual) some people from the local church and the family members of the campers at the evening devotions.

I give thanks for both the children who came to the camp and for all who served together with us in this camp.

I am looking forward to the next opportunity.

Childrens and youth camp in Lucfalva, July 2017

I waited for the July 17–22 camp with excitement. Since I couldn't participate last year, for there were two camps at the same time, I wanted to know how much the children had changed, and to see again those I knew from before, who would be there. It was a great feeling to welcome one another with a lot of new acquaintances.

I served among schoolchildren of the age of 7 to 12; then we further divided this age group: one group of the 9 to 12 year old girls, led by Melinda, one group of boys with János Herkely and Zoli, and a mixed group of 7 to 9 year old children, where János Lacki and I were with the children from the second day. After the second day, we decided with János to divide this group of 17 children, and take them to talk in two separate groups. This proved to be a good decision: the children were braver and more open in the small groups.

Some children had very good knowledge of Bible stories, and when we asked questions, they answered immediately. When we were talking of fears, many little girls spoke of their fears at night, when they wake up, see a piece of furniture and think someone is standing there. A girl was fighting fears after watching horror films. Some of the boys feared hell or the devil; they had not yet come to the realization that they could turn to Jesus in prayer and ask Him to help.

Vanessa was listening very carefully, and grasping all she heard; I noticed this on the first day. While talking, she recognized her sins, with which she had grieved both God and her beloved ones. By Friday, the Holy Spirit of God inspired her to confess her sins, and to ask for forgiveness. It was in a personal conversation with her that Vanessa gave her life to the LORD Jesus Christ, and received Him into her life.

On the same day, I noticed Liliána, too. She was very near to going through the narrow gate, but she decided to sleep over it. On Saturday, she was ready to bring her sins before Jesus, to ask our Lord to forgive her, and to give her life to Him. It was fantastic to hear her only 15 minutes later, when she came to me in the canteen, and said, "Miss Márti! This is something wonderful! I feel so light here inside!" And she began to stroke her breast, showing she had really knew that God had set her free. Liliana was a second grade schoolgirl, and Vanessa left the first grade in June.

It made me rejoice to experience that God can work in the hearts of children of this age, and answer the contrition coming from the heart by giving His deliverance.

It was good to see Anita and Elena, too; they also longed to be cleansed, and I believe they will belong to Jesus in the next camp.

I left the camp with joyful and grateful heart. Since then, I have told several brothers and sisters what our Lord did in the hearts of the children. Nothing is impossible for Him. Soli Deo gloria! Márta Stanka

Teaching on the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation

The Lucfalva childrens and youth camp this year were held between July 17 and 22. It was the 15th childrens camp and the 5th youth camp here.

57 children and 32 teens came to the camp from 14 towns and villages. The leaders of the camp also arrived from different places in the country; it was good to experience serving together in unity in Christ. It was joy to see this fellowship with kitchen helpers, too. In the morning teachings, we learned with children and teens about the "sola" principles of the Reformation (Sola Gratia, Sola Scriptura, Sola Fide, Solus Christus, Soli Deo Gloria) through various Bible stories; then we went on to talk about them in small groups. In the evenings, campers together with parents and other adults joining us from the village heard teaching on Martin Luther's life.

Many games, sports and craft made the programs more colorful. The participants even made a huge Luther Rose out of the Tshirts they received. This year, just like earlier, the teens prepared a play. They used the side of the "Boka Hill" by the village as the stage, while the audience members were seated in the courtyard of the church.

It is joyful that we not only remembered the Reformation, but we could live it as well. Two children trusted the Lord, and many were renewed in their relationships with Jesus. We are thankful to our Lord for this week. Soli Deo Gloria!


Scripture Distribution
