### MEET OUR 2020 LABOR DAY RETREAT MISSIONARIES



Adámi Johanna (35) & Horváth-Hegyi Áron (41)

Both of us – wife and husband – are from faithful protestant families. Johanna is from a family of nine (one of her sisters who was disabled died 3 years ago at the age of 28), Áron is from a family of eight. Church was our childhood's natural part – especially for Johanna whose father is a Lutheran pastor. At the moment both of our parents live in Nyíregyháza, in the eastern part of Hungary, more than 140 miles from our home. We moved to our present home (Sámsonháza, Nógrád county) five and a half years ago, when Aron was placed here (by the bishop and the congregation's call) for pastoral service. Before this he was the secretary for the bishop for five years in the capital and Johanna worked as a conductive education teacher (who develops motor-disordered children). The move was a big change although this calm and safe environment and the great garden is just ideal for our five kids: Ruben (10), Lea (8), Zoé (6), Lídia (4), Benjámin (2). They go to kindergarten and school in the nearby city (Pásztó) where we also manage our daily administrative and shopping duties. On the other hand we have our other congregation here to pastor and many religious education class to cope with.

We are really thankful for our kids whom we accept from God as gift and blessing. Our life is going in love and harmony. We are often amazed how much power and love we receive from God to fulfill parenthood, this such a responsible task. We know that without Him we would fail. As we are lack of daily human help we have to schedule and organize our days very carefully.

We have been married for over eleven years. One of our important Bible verse is from Ecc 4:12b: *"A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."* This is engraved into our rings to be remembered how much we have to rely on God.

Our relationship with EKE is very close. Johanna has a longer past as she has been participating in different events since 1998 through her father. Aron joined in 2002 (through Johanna) and officially became member in 2017. It's such a joy to belong to a community where we are all brothers and sisters in Christ and where we can sincerely share our joys and sorrows too and serve God with one faith.

We trust and pray that we can represent the EKE community truly and worthily.

We spent our first week at Wycliffe headquarters in Orlando getting loved on and caught up on many new-to-us things. We arrived in Seattle, Washington Feb 20th to pick up the car we are renting from Righteous Rides, and drove over to the Tri-Cities. Up next we have eye doctor and dental appointments, as well as pulling out those coats and warm-weather clothes. We plan to head to Wisconsin March 4<sup>th</sup> for a three-month stay when we hope to see those of you in the Midwest.

Thank you for praying! We are blessed to have you as part of our amazing partnership team. You prayed for housing for us, and God connected us with a FURNISHED house in Wisconsin. Greetings from NLM in Mongolia By David Olson

I would first and foremost like to say that all of our Missionaries in Mongolia are doing well and we are thankful for all the prayer and support we receive from not only people in Norway but also from the U.S. and Hauge Foreign Mission. There is so much that is happening right now around the world with the corona virus but we must thank the Lord that we are all healthy in Mongolia and that He is with us in all we do each and every day. Isaiah 41: 10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

The corona virus has also affected daily life in Mongolia. The Mongolian government, already in January, took several large steps to prepare for this pandemic by closing all schools, churches, and public places. This has in fact been in affect the past two months and could continue for at least one more month. In addition there has been several times where the Mongolian government has restricted travel, which has meant that the NLM Mongolia Missionaries have been in quarantine for several weeks. This was even done when there were no confirmed cases in Mongolia during the January and February months. The corona virus has now been confirmed in Mongolia and we can assume the restrictions and closings will continue for a while.

For NLM Mongolia, we have tried to work as normal but with all the travel restrictions and closings av schools, churches and other public institutions it has been quiet in regards to our work. We have had several meetings cancelled and have even asked our employees to work from home.

But we have had some good news that we can thank the Lord for. Our new project, "Strengthening Children with Disabilities Development" (SCD) has received approval from NLM in Norway. This project aims at helping local parental organizations who deal with children with disabilities in providing better care for these children. So, we have begun with preparations for the implementation of project activities for the next five years. Again, we must thank the Lord that NLM has the opportunity to work with this important project in Mongolia.

We have also experience much joy in regards to Church work and evangelization even if Churches have been closed for the past two

months. We have especially seen the Lord work in the hearts of local believers in western Mongolia as there has been a renewed yearning to study and learn more from God's Word. Some of our Missionaries work directly with mentoring and teaching and even though it has been difficult to hold regular meetings because of the corona virus situation we have seen the thirsting for God's Word. John 6:35 "Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst." Please continue to pray for Christians in Mongolia and for the Mongolian Evangelical Lutheran Church and the unreached people group that NLM works with in western Mongolia. Otherwise, we can report that in the midst of all this craziness with the corona virus we had 17 visitors from our NLM schools and organization in Norway during the last week of February and first week of January. NLM in Norway sends groups of students and teachers from their schools in Norway each year to visit the different mission areas to help bring back information to Norway. This is very important for both prayer and financial support. Amazingly the Lord opened doors so that they arrived in Khovd safely and departed from Mongolia again safely before any serious travel restrictions. These visits also give us Missionaries needed fellowship and encouragement.



So, NLM Mongolia, must continue to give praise and thanks to our Lord and Savior for all He has done for us and that He continues to watch over us.
